

EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY/AFFIRMATIVE ACTION POLICY STATEMENT

Federal and state laws prohibit employment discrimination. As CEO of North American Savings Bank, F.S.B. Data may include outside hires, promotions, transfers, terminations, identification of problem areas and, if necessary, a recommended plan of action. Employees of, and applicants to, NASB will not be subject to harassment, intimidation, threats, coercion, or discrimination because they have filed a complaint, assisted in a review, investigation, or hearing, or have otherwise sought to obtain their legal rights related to any federal, state, or local law regarding equal employment opportunity. Personnel found guilty of violating this directive will be subject to discipline and possible termination.
